



## Camp County Quick Facts 2018

### Demographics

- Camp County's percent of population growth is 3.7%. This is higher than Region 4's rate (2.9%), and lower than the state rate (12.6 %) and the U.S. rate (5.5%).
- The majority of Camp County's population (24.9%) is between the ages of 45-64 followed by the ages of 0-17 at (24.8%). Camp County has the 3<sup>rd</sup> highest percent of the population between the ages of 18-24 in the region (9.8%).

### Socioeconomics

- Camp County has the 3<sup>rd</sup> lowest per capita income in Region 4 at \$20,034. It is significantly lower than that of the Region (\$22,678), Texas (\$27,828), and the United States (\$29,829).
- Camp County has one of the lowest percent of single-parent households (28%) compared to the region (33%) and the state (33%).
- Camp County ranks 3<sup>rd</sup> for the most number of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)/Food Stamp recipients in the region at 20.6 per a population of 100 compared to Region 4 (15.1) and the state (13.9).
- Camp County's percent of children under the age of 18 living in poverty (27.3%) is higher than the regional rate (26.5%) and the state (23.9%).

### Education

- Camp County has one of the lowest dropout rates in the region (1.1%), which is significantly lower than the state rate of 6.2%, and the regional rate of 3.6%.
- Camp County has the 2<sup>nd</sup> lowest rate of high school to college enrollment per 100 students in the region; significantly lower than that of the state (47 vs. 57.5) and the region (43.8 vs. 53.3).

### Family Violence

- Camp County's rate of confirmed victims of child abuse/neglect per 1,000 children (13.7) is equal to the regional rate (13.7) and significantly higher than the state rate (8.6).

### Alcohol & Drug-Related Crimes

- Camp County has the 8<sup>th</sup> highest rate of DUI fatalities per 100,000 people at (7.8), which is significantly higher than that of the state (2.7) and the region (5.6).
- Camp County has the 4<sup>th</sup> lowest rate of alcohol and drug-related incarcerations per 10,000 people at (9.3), which is significantly lower than that of the region (21.3) and the state (10.7).



## Texas School Survey- Youth Regional Consumption

- **Marijuana:** Students in Regions 4&5 have **higher rates than the state for current, school year use, and lifetime use for all grades (Grades 7-12).**
- **Prescription Drugs:** Students in Regions 4&5 have **higher numbers for prescription drug use. Regions 4&5 have the highest reported current (30-day) use, school year use, and lifetime use for all grades and for the 12<sup>th</sup> grade in the state.** It should be noted that the reported lifetime use for 7<sup>th</sup> graders (14.4%) is not too far behind lifetime use for all grades (20.4%).
- **Prescription Drugs:** Students in Regions 4&5 have **higher reported rates than the state for the two opioid categories ('Codeine Cough Syrup' and 'OxyContin, Percodan, Percocet, Oxycodone, Vicodin, Lortab, Lorcet, Hydrocodone').**
- **Alcohol:** Students in Regions 4&5 **report substantially higher usage of alcohol in every category compared to the state.**

## Teen Births

- Camp County has the **2<sup>nd</sup> highest percent of teen pregnancies in the region (13.4%),** which is significantly higher than that of the state (8.1%) and the region (10.3%).

## Mental Health

- Camp County has **one of the lowest rates of mental health providers available per 10,000 people (5),** which is significantly lower than that of the state (14) and the region (10).
- Of the **percentage of the Medicare population that report depression, Camp County has the 2<sup>nd</sup> lowest in the region (15.6%),** compared to Region 4 (17.6%) and the state (17%).

## ETCADA Substance Abuse Screenings

- Camp County's rate of ETCADA substance abuse screening calls per 1,000 people (2.3) is slightly lower than that of the region (2.7).

## Health Factors

- Camp County **ranks #193 out of the 242 Texas counties that were ranked for social determinants of health,** which include health behaviors, clinical care, social and economic factors, and physical environment.
- Camp County has **one of the highest adult smoking rates in the entire state at 17%.**
